2018 Sustainability Symposium

Bucknell University's sixth annual Sustainability Symposium will be held on campus from Monday, March 19 - Friday, March 23.

This symposium is presented by the University's Center for Sustainability & the Environment, along with the Office of the President, Career Development Center, Bucknell Institute for Public Policy, Humanities Center, Outdoor Education & Leadership Program, Office of Campus Sustainability, the Writing Center and several academic departments.

Highlights Include

Faculty from diverse disciplines will present snap talks on Monday, March 19 and Tuesday, March 20.

On Thursday, March 22, Graciela Chichilnisky, Ph.D., author of the carbon market of the Kyoto Protocol (the international agreement linked to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change) will present "The Mathematics of Uncertainty." Chichilnisky, a professor of economics and

mathematical statistics at Columbia University, also contributed to reports of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), the organization that shared the 2007 Nobel Peace Prize with Al Gore, "for their efforts to build up and disseminate greater knowledge about man-made climate change, and to lay the foundations for the measures that are needed to counteract such change."

Five Bucknell alumni will participate in a panel discussion of "Career Paths in Sustainability" on Friday, March 23: Rob Nicholas '94, Jess Scott '08, Katelyn Tsukada '12, Guy Williams '76, and Nga Nguyen '08 (video conference).
